## ABOUT THE ARTISTS

**JJJJJerome Ellis** is a stuttering, Afro-Caribbean composer, performer, and writer. His current practice explores Blackness, music, and disabled speech as forces of refusal and healing. He is a 2019 MacDowell Colony Fellow, a writer in residence at Lincoln Center Theater, and a 2015 Fulbright Fellow.

Catherine Brookman (she/her) is a performer/composer based in Brooklyn and Los Angeles. Recent performances include Meredith Monk's *ATLAS* with the LA Philharmonic (Walt Disney Concert Hall), singing soprano solo with electronics on a piece by William Brittelle with the Charlotte Symphony, an all-night drone concert with Grammy-nominated LA ensemble Wild Up, with jazz and pop acts Esperanza Spalding (Baltimore Symphony) and Lorde (Electric Lady), in Dave Malloy's *Natasha*, *Pierre & the Great Comet of 1812* (Off-Broadway) and *Hair* (Broadway). She composes music for theatre, film, and opera and her work has been seen/heard at Lincoln Center, The Public, Ars Nova, Nitehawk Cinema, HERE Arts, rooftops, galleries, apartments and more. As a composer/performer she has created full-length scores for William Burke's Variations on the Main (JACK), PIONEERS#goforth (JACK), The Shes (The Public), La déroute: A Water Opera (3LD) with Helen Banner, Rady&Bloom's The Upper Room (NYTimes Critic's Pick, New Ohio) and The Girl of the Golden West (co-composer; ANT Fest, Ice Factory). Originally from Baltimore, she performs her art pop project under the name Sullivann and was recently featured live at The Greene Space on WNYC. She will release her debut visual EP, Elements, this Summer.

Starr Busby is an experimental artist who sings, acts, composes, educates and is dedicated to the liberation of All people. You may have seen Starr playing solo shows with their loop station, Francis, or fronting Brooklyn-based experimental soul band People's Champs (peopleschamps.com). Starr has also supported artists such as The Gorillaz, Esperanza Spalding, X Ambassadors, Kimbra and Alice Smith. Selected appearances include: Moby Dick (American Repertory Theatre; Starbuck); Octet (Signature Theatre; Paula – Drama Desk Award Winner); where love lies fallow (The Shed; Nia 1); Apollo Cafe Live: Soul Cypher; #BlackGirlMagic Show (Jack; composer/performer); Mikrokosmos (Steirischer Herbst, Graz and Nottingham Contemporary); The Girl with the Incredible Feeling (Spoleto Festival di Mondi) as well as various concerts. Starr also enjoys working as an arts educator through organizations such as Carnegie Hall's Lullaby Project and Long Island University's Post Theatre Company where they are a member of the musical theatre department's voice faculty. She is looking forward to continuing the development of (pray) with nicHi douglas and JJJJJerome Ellis at Ars Nova. Their music is available via Bandcamp, Spotify and Apple Music.

Haruna Lee is a Taiwanese/Japanese/American theater maker, television writer, educator and community steward whose work is rooted in a liberation-based healing practice. They are committed to promoting arts activism and emergent strategies for the theater through ethical and process-based collaborations that challenge systems and legacies of power, while inviting the fullness of marginalized bodies and the complexity of lived experience to their practice. Recent plays include *Suicide Forest* published by 53rd State Press (Ma-Yi Theater Company and The Bushwick Starr), plural (love) (Soho Rep Writer/Director Lab; New Georges), and *Memory Retrograde* (UTR; Ars Nova; BAX). Lee is a recipient of an Obie Award for Playwriting and Conception of *Suicide Forest*, an FCA Grants to Artists Award, received the Mohr Visiting Artist Fellowship at Stanford University, a MacDowell Fellowship, the Map Fund Grant, and Lotos Foundation Prize for Directing. They were a member of the 2019 artEquity cohort, and are a co-founder and lead facilitator for the Women-Trans-Femme-Non Binary Asian Diasporic Performance Makers Potluck. They are currently writing for HBO Max *The Flight Attendant*. They received their M.F.A. from Brooklyn College under the tutelage of Mac Wellman and Erin Courtney, and a B.F.A. from NYU Experimental Theater Wing. | *harunalee.com*
